

ways desired this. For example, God provided for Israel when He rescued them out of Egypt (Ex. 16:4). He provided for Elijah during a great famine (1 Kings 17:2-6). Amaziah was advised how God is capable of providing much more than he realized (2 Chron. 25:9). There are a multitude of verses that illustrate this point and each harmonize beautifully with passages like Psalm 84:11, Luke 6:35-38, 2 Corinthians 9:8, James 1:5, and Philippians 4:10-19.

The reality is this: God cares about our greatest and smallest need. We should ever be thankful that we can put our complete dependence upon the Father. He is able to provide for all of our physical and spiritual needs. He desires that we have faith in Him, because He loves us and cares for us. This was greatly manifested in the fact that He sent His only begotten Son to save us from death caused by sin (John 3:16). If God cares enough to give us His Son, He certainly cares enough to provide our daily needs. I pray this will encourage you. Remember what Jesus taught—praise God and put it in His hands.
